'Works in Progress' include Her Excellency the Hon Linda Dessau AC by Yvette Coppersmith, the Hon Geoffrey Nettle AC by Jude Rae and photo portraits of Nimal Wikramanayake KC and Barbara Hocking OAM, in the latter case recognising her very significant contribution to the legal recognition of native title and the framework for the *Mabo* case.
